35 Mizumakannon Station
Constructed in 1926 when the Mizuma Railway opened. Most of the original station remains, and it was registered as a tangible cultural property in 1999. The station name was originally Mizuma, but changed to Mizumakannon in 2009.



37 Mizumadera Temple
Founded by Gyoki during the Nara period under orders of Emperor Shomu. It enshrines the sacred KannonBodhisattva, known for warding off misfortune. On January 2-3, a ceremony making mochi takes place.



21 Inari Shrine
Known as a merged temple from ancient times, various shrines in Kijima were merged in 1908. It celebrated 800 years in 2018, and the main hall was renovated.



27 Myoujunji Temple
Affiliated with Honganji Temple. A temple for the powerful clan that migrated from Omi. It was founded during the Muromachi Period. The temple is said to be named after the wife of.



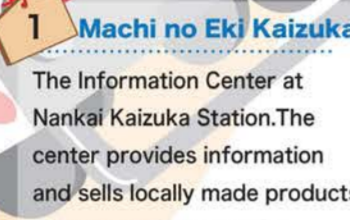
29 Eijuike Reservoir
The largest reservoir in Kaizuka and was built by Gyoki during the Nara period. The circumference is about 1.5 km and it covers about 75,000 square meters. There are surrounding paths and open areas with excellent views.



31 Zenbei Land
Built to commemorate Iwahashi Zenbei, a telescope maker in the Edo period. It houses one of the largest reflecting telescopes in Osaka Prefecture, and there are also other telescopes and celestial globes created by Zenbei.



42 Henjoji Temple
Affiliated with the Shingon Onshitsu sect. The worshiped deity is a wooden Kobo Daishi. The temple was founded by Kobo Daishi and revived in the 16th century by Agan. The temple is visited by many followers when special rituals are held on April 5th every year.



1 Machi no Eki Kaizuka
The Information Center at Nankai Kaizuka Station. The center provides information and sells locally made products. Please use the space for socializing and resting. There is also a diaper changing and nursing area.



38 Aizendo Hall
Located in Mizumadera Temple, the hall enshrines Aizen Myoo, the deity of love. It is also associated with the legend of Onatsu and Seijuro, a love story between lovers of different social statuses. In 2017, it was selected as a Lover's Sanctuary spot.



39 Mizuma Park
A 5.4 hectare, lush green park behind Mizumadera Temple. The park is beautiful throughout the seasons. It is a popular place during cherry blossom season. The grass lawn and giant slide are also enjoyed by the local community.



43 Nishikatsuragi Shrine
The shrine is a merging of several shrines in Nishikatsuragi in 1910 during the Meiji period. Kusunoki Shrine is said to be established by the Matsuura clan to enshrine Kusunoki Masashige.



45 Ko-onji Temple
Affiliated with Chion-in Temple. The main hall is Kannondo, designated as a national treasure and built in the Nara period. There are also many important cultural properties housed here.



47 Yujo No Haka
Chiyono, a courtesan in the Edo period, fell ill on her way back to her hometown and passed away here. Moved by her death, the villagers built this grave. Chiyono's memorial is enshrined at Daifukuji Temple.



52 Doroku Shrine
Commonly known as "Doroku-san," the god of the foot. The legend began with soldiers bathing their injured feet in the clear water and getting cured. There are festivals on July 31st and October 19th.



57 Mt. Izumikatsuragi
858 m high, enshrining the Takaokami Shrine. There are two routes to the summit. One along the valley along the stream from Sobura Bus Stop, and the other following the ridge. Enjoy a panoramic view, including Kansai International Airport and Awaji Island.

9 Sekizenji Temple & Castle Ruins
9,500 Negoro monk warriors barricaded themselves during Toyotomi Hideyoshi's attack on Kishu.

11 Chigozuka
A 40cm stone marker on the corner of a rice field. In the Nara period, a child guided Gyoki to Mizuma when he was lost.

14 Takaijo Castle Ruins
During Toyotomi Hideyoshi's attack on Kishu, 200 farmers barricaded themselves in Sengokubori Castle, eventually falling to Hideyoshi's forces.

15 Anyoji Temple
Affiliated with Chion-in Temple. The worshiped deity is a wooden Amida Nyorai. There are also special chanting ceremonies held during the spring and autumn equinoxes.

16 Joshoji Temple
Affiliated with Honganji Temple. The worshiped deity is a wooden Amida Nyorai. The current main hall is Kaiganji Temple, relocated in the early Meiji period to enshrine the Tokugawa family.

19 Sengokuborijo Castle Ruins
Several thousand Negoro monk warriors barricaded and fought during Toyotomi Hideyoshi's attack on Kishu. The castle fell when a fire arrow ignited the gunpowder warehouse, causing a massive explosion.

22 Fudodo Hall
The hall enshrines the Fudomyo statue. The former Seishoji chief priest memorial is housed here due to many shrines being abolished in the Meiji period.

23 Yukimatu Residence Hackberry
A designated natural monument. The tree was planted in an official's garden during the Edo period, and is estimated to be about 300 years old.

28 Tsujido Hall
Built in the Ansei period, the Jizo hall was recently reconstructed. A chanting ceremony is held on August 14th every year.

32 Kuroiwa Daimyojin
A black stone about 1 m tall. It is called "Kuroiwa-san" and is revered as the deity of textiles. A torii gate is built in front of the stone to enshrine it.

36 Oujin Temple
The worshiped deity is a wooden Amida Nyorai. A subtemple of Mizumadera Temple, it is to be where Gyoki, the founder of Mizumadera Temple, passed away.

44 Kostumi Farm Center
Local farm produce is sold every Sunday. It is popular for bamboo shoots in the spring, and during grape season in the summer, the center is open weekdays as well.

46 Daifukuji Temple
Affiliated with Chion-in Temple. The main deity is a standing Amida Nyorai. The temple also enshrines the memorial of Chiyono, a courtesan who met a tragic death in the Edo period.

48 Konpukuji Castle Ruins & Lord's Grave
Built as Nodayamajo Castle in the Muromachi period and later renamed as Konpukujijo. On the other side of the ruins, there is communal cemetery with a gravestone for the lord.

49 Sugawara Shrine Kakuremino Tree
The tree is 14 m tall, a large height in the inland mountainous area. It is designated as a prefectural natural monument.

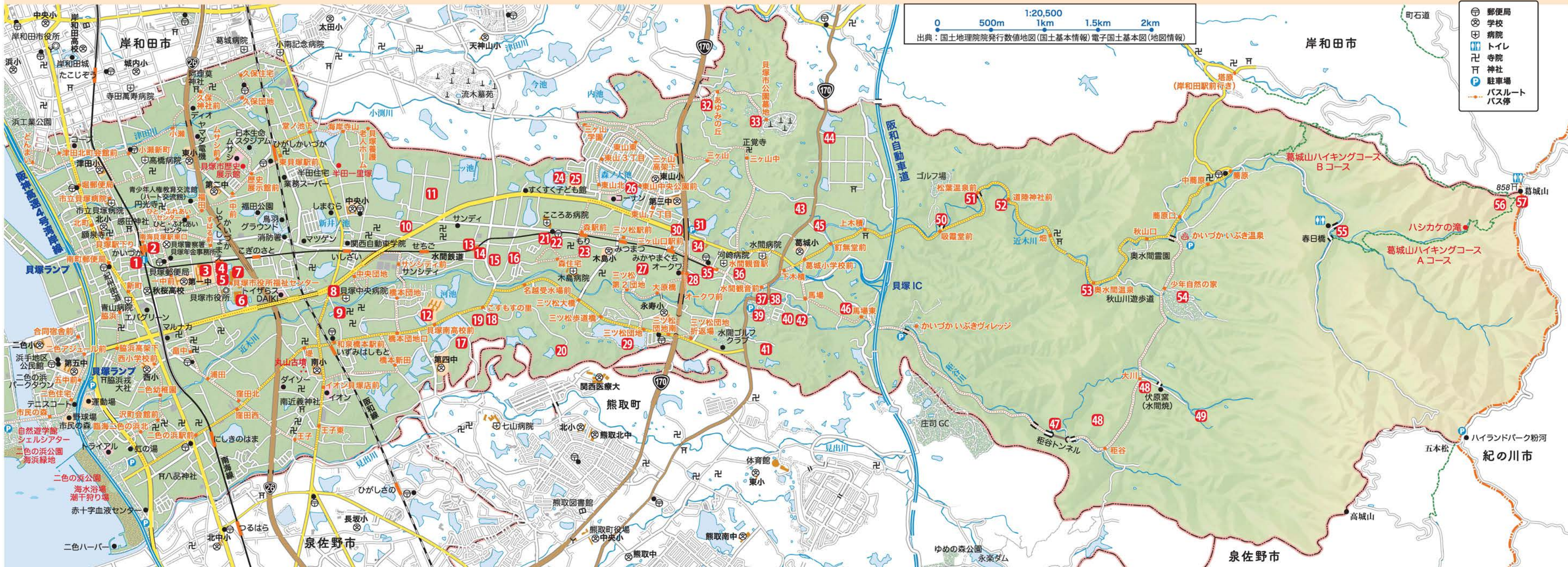
