Sengokuborijo Castle Ruins

Several thousand Negoro monk warriors barricaded and fought during Toyotomi Hideyoshi' s attack on Kishu. The castle fell when a fire arrow ignited the gunpowder warehouse, causing a massive explosion

## Chigozuka

A 40cm stone marker on the corner of a rice field. In the Nara period, a child guided Gyoki to Mizuma when he was lost.



**Fudodo Hall** 

The hall enshrines the Fudomyo statue. The former Seishoii chief priest memorial is housed here due to many shrines being abolished in the Meiji period.



Kostumi Farm Center

Local farm produce is sold every Sunday. It is popular for bamboo shoots in the spring, and during grape season in the summer, the center is open weekdays as well.



**Mizumakannon Station** 

Constructed in 1926 when the Mizuma Railway opened. Most of the original station remains and it was registered as a tangible cultural property in 1999. The station name was originally Mizuma, but changed o Mizumakannon in 2009.



Aizendo Hall Located in Mizumadera Temple, the hall enshrines Aizen Myoo. the diety of love.lt is also associated with the legend of Onatsu and Seijuro, a love story between lovers of different social statuses In 2017, it was selected as a


Tsuiido Hall Built in the Ansei period, the Jizo

Konpukuii Castle Ruins & Lord's Grave Built as Nodayamajo Castle in the Muromachi period and later enamed as Konpukujijo. On the other side of the ruins, there is communal cemetary with a gravestone for the lord.





Sugawara Shrine

The tree is 14 m tall, a large area. It is designated as a prefectural natural monument.



**Inari Shrine** 

Known as a merged temple from ancient times, various shrines in Kijima were merged in 1908. It celebrated 800 years in 2018, and the main hall was renovated.


